Job Opportunity for Clinical Consult (Part-Time, Contract)

PEI Rape and Sexual Assault Centre (PEIRSAC) is a feminist, pro-choice, not-for-profit organization that has been providing services in Prince Edward Island since 1983. Our mission is to provide high-quality, trauma-informed services to those affected by sexualized violence while advancing gender equity and social justice. We are committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and supportive community rooted in feminist and anti-oppressive principles.

Position Type: Part-Time, Contract

Start Date: As soon as possible.

Hours: 10 - 13 hours per week.

Compensation: \$90.00 hourly to be invoiced on a biweekly basis. Outside consultation may be considered pending approval by the executive director.

Location: Office space to be provided on an as-needed basis within our Charlottetown office.

The PEI Rape and Sexual Assault Centre (PEIRSAC) is seeking a Clinical Consultant to provide part-time clinical consultation and support through a trauma-informed, anti-oppressive, and feminist lens. The Clinical Consultant will have extensive experience in trauma-informed care, particularly in supporting survivors of sexual violence, including adults, adolescents, and children (12 and over).

Qualifications

- **Master's Degree:** In Social Work, Clinical Psychology, or a related field, with current registration with the appropriate professional body.
- **Clinical Experience:** Minimum of five years experience in clinical practice, particularly working with survivors of sexualized violence, complex trauma, childhood sexual violence, historical sexualized violence, and dissociative defences.
- **Commitment to Anti-Oppressive Practice:** Demonstrated critical analysis of social and cultural factors contributing to sexualized violence, with a strong commitment to anti-oppressive, decolonizing, and feminist practices.
- **Supervision and Mentorship Experience:** Proven experience in supervising or mentoring clinical staff, therapists, or practicum students in trauma-informed care.
- **Case Management Expertise:** Extensive experience in case management, including maintaining confidential client records and adhering to reporting standards.



- **Therapeutic Modalities:** Proficiency in trauma-informed therapeutic modalities such as, but not limited to: Feminist Narrative, EMDR, Sensorimotor Psychotherapy, Internal Family Systems, Compassion-Focused Therapy, and mindfulness-based approaches.
- **Legal and Ethical Knowledge:** Familiarity with Prince Edward Island's legal frameworks and ethical considerations specific to sexual violence, including client confidentiality, consent, and reporting requirements.
- **Collaborative Practice:** Ability to collaborate effectively with a multidisciplinary clinical team and attend monthly meetings to discuss therapeutic needs and recommendations.

Essential Skills

- **Clinical Consultation Experience:** Proven experience providing clinical consultation, particularly in trauma-informed care for survivors of sexualized violence and childhood sexual abuse.
- **Collaboration with Clinical Team:** Demonstrated ability to collaborate effectively with the clinical team, providing consultation and guidance on complex trauma cases, ensuring inclusive and comprehensive care.
- **Cultural Competence:** Awareness of diverse cultural backgrounds, with the ability to apply trauma-informed practices that respect the lived experiences of marginalized communities, including BIPOC, 2SLGBTQ+, and newcomers.
- **Strong Communication Skills:** Clear, empathetic communication skills essential for supporting staff, offering therapeutic recommendations, and facilitating effective case management.
- **Research and Evidence-Based Practices:** Knowledge of current research and trends in trauma therapy, particularly related to survivors of sexualized violence, with the ability to apply evidence-based practices in consultation.
- **Experience with Vicarious Trauma:** Proven experience supporting clinical staff in managing vicarious trauma and burnout, particularly in high-intensity, trauma-focused environments.
- **Case Management Skills:** Expertise in managing cases, maintaining high standards of client confidentiality, documentation, and reporting in compliance with agency policies.
- **Meeting Participation:** Regularly attend monthly staff and consultation meetings with the Executive Director to discuss therapeutic needs and provide clinical recommendations.
- **Supportive Environment:** Contribute to a collaborative and supportive work environment by engaging with clinicians, program coordinators, and management teams to enhance service provision and ensure consistent application of trauma-informed care practices.



Assets to the Position

- **Technological Proficiency in Clinical Tools:** Experience using clinical software systems for case management, documentation, and reporting, and proficiency in telehealth platforms for remote consultation.
- **Community Networking:** Established relationships with community organizations and service providers, particularly those that support marginalized or underserved populations, to help coordinate additional resources and referrals.
- **Experience in Advocacy:** Experience working in or with advocacy organizations focused on gender-based violence, human rights, or social justice, particularly those that support survivors of sexual violence.
- **Multilingual Abilities:** Proficiency in languages other than English, especially **Mi'kmaq**, **French** or languages commonly spoken by newcomers or refugees in PEI.
- **Experience with Indigenous Healing Practices:** Familiarity with Indigenous healing practices, including traditional approaches to trauma and wellness, and the ability to incorporate these perspectives into therapeutic recommendations.
- **Experience with Disability Justice Frameworks:** Knowledge of disability justice and trauma-informed approaches tailored to individuals with disabilities, ensuring accessibility in trauma therapy and consultations.
- **Conflict Mediation and Resolution Skills:** Specialized training or experience in conflict mediation, particularly within multidisciplinary teams or therapeutic settings.
